MUSICAL THEATRE CLUB

Sponsored by Mrs. Tsompanidis (Mrs. T) and Ms. Hill, students in grades 3-5 must audition to be in this club. Auditions will be held in November. An email will be sent out with audition details to those who are interested in auditioning. The purpose of this club is to rehearse the school musical learning choreography, songs and acting lines while exploring characterization, developing ensemble building, and fostering self-confidence. We hope to nurture an appreciation of the arts and a sense of community within our school. All students participating in the Musical Theatre Club will be in the show and faithful attendance is required. Tech week and performances are scheduled for the week of April 15, 2019. There is a \$20 fee for the club which includes cast t-shirts.

ART CLUB

The club has a limited number of members due to material consumption and space so an application to join is required. Membership is free.
