Before your child enters 7th grade, proof of current vaccinations is required. To help parents protect their children from vaccine-preventable diseases, the Department of Health in Volusia County (DOH-Volusia) and Volusia County Schools are working together to offer **no-cost** vaccines.

If you would like your child to receive the recommended vaccinations, please plan on bringing them to one of these school events from **9.a.m. – 1:00p.m.** Consent forms should be returned to the school office by May 28, 2021, but forms will also be available the day of the event.

The following recommended vaccines protect adolescents from serious preventable diseases:

- Tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis (Tdap)
- Meningococcal
- Human papillomavirus (HPV)
