ADMISSION CRITERIA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The child needs to meet the criteria set by Medicaid with regards to medically justifiable behavioral health needs. • The child will be assessed by an AHH behavioral health clinician and will meet the criteria for service if the child's maladaptive behaviors rise to a level that justifies a mental health diagnosis (DSM-IV Criteria) • The child is enrolled in Medicaid and in the Magellan Health Services HMO. • The client has not been diagnosed by a physician or therapist with Autism, or Pervasive Developmental Disorder, and the child is not receiving services thru the Medicaid Med Waiver program. • The services are voluntary and as such the client as well as family have to be active and willing participants. • All referral sources are welcomed, be it Family, School, DJJ, Child Welfare, Physician and the court system
AVERAGE LENGTH OF SERVICE	Varies according to treatment and progress in treatment Average length of stay is 3 to 6 months. (Services need to meet the medically justifiable guidelines set by Medicaid)
SERVICES PROVIDED	Services are delivered in the home, the school, the community or any combination there of as needed. Therapist are master level or licensed in their specialty and overseen by Board Certified Adolescent and Adult Psychiatrist. Targeted Case Management services are designed to be the advocate in the community for the child and work to assist the family in meeting the child's behavioral health service needs. The TCM will work with the family to identify

	<p>the child's service needs, develop a plan for service and work to implement that plan with the intention of having the child meet the agreed upon service goals. All the while meeting the Medicaid guidelines for the deliver of TCM services. Also available are psychiatric services with a Board Certified Adolescent and Adult Psychiatrist where the child would be referred for a psychiatric evaluation (only if needed) and would receive ongoing medication management services thru AHH.</p>

PURPOSE/MISSION	Provide group care to abused, neglected, and/or abandoned children in a nurturing, home-like environment.
ADMISSION CRITERIA	Each child will be reviewed individually and a decision by CHS staff in conjunction with Community Partnership for Children shall be made in consideration of all presenting factors. In general: Child must be able to attend classes in Volusia County School System or alternative program. Child must not be presenting a potential danger to himself or others. Child must not be mentally retarded or have neurological disorder. Child must not have anti-social traits or behavior. Child must not have an existing medical condition, which requires acute medical or nursing care. Any child with an extensive history of physical violence or sexual offenses shall be looked at in terms of the potential for these behaviors to arise and become destructive to the program. Candidates for placement are not eligible if they are violent, assaultive, psychotic, homicidal, or fire setters. Candidates for placement are not eligible if they are pregnant or are determined to be pregnant after placement.

PURPOSE/MISSION	The campus currently provides a variety of holistic services to a diverse group of children ranging from ages 6-17 in thirteen cottage settings. We utilize a house parent model in the residential group setting.
CRITERIA FOR ADMIT	Our Admission process begins with your first call to us or when we receive your completed Screening Application . The information that you provide to us helps to determine if we should schedule an assessment or refer to another provider that would support the child remaining in your home. An assessment is scheduled with our Family Services Specialist, who will work closely with you in preparing your child for admission to the Children's Home.

AVERAGE LENGTH OF STAY	You and your child's therapist will be working together to establish treatment plan goals and objectives for your child to be working on during their stay with us. Children are discharged from our program when they have reached their treatment plan goals. You and your child's therapist will be working together to determine the best time for your child's discharge from our care.
COUNSELOR INFORMATION	The clinical needs of each resident are served by the Child and Family Therapy assigned to the campus Home where the child lives. Clinicians receive ongoing training in trauma-informed care from our in-house licensed staff. Clinicians specialize in a variety of areas including EMDR, play therapy, substance abuse treatment and anger management. Ongoing treatment team meetings are held under the direction of the Psychiatrist to staff the needs of each child. A variety of clinical disorders and behaviors are attended to that include but are not limited to: Oppositional Defiant Disorder, Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, ADHD, Attachment Disorder, Bi Polar, Depression, substance use/abuse, self-injurious behaviors, sexually acting out behaviors, and impulse-control issues.
SERVICES PROVIDED	Education: In the residential setting, children attend Volusia County schools and receive after school tutoring services twice a week from certified teachers in the community. FUMCH also has a fully accredited, on campus, private school to further meet the specialized needs of the children in our care. Recreation: The children have numerous opportunities to participate in a variety of activities throughout the week. Outdoor activities

	<p>include flag football, baseball, tennis, a Ropes course, and swimming in our Olympic-sized pool. The gymnasium is used as a gym and an auditorium. Indoor games in the gym include basketball, dodge ball, and kickball. This facility also provides a life skills training room, an arts and crafts room, and a game room for the residents' entertainment. Additionally, we have a state-of-the-art weight room with a certified trainer who assists the youth in appropriate weight training techniques for strength building.</p> <p>Wellness Center - The Wellness Center focuses on the health, and wellness of residents and staff. Our Medical Director is a Board Certified Child and Adolescent Psychiatrist and also has an office in the Wellness Center. The psychiatrist completes a psychiatric assessment upon each child's admission to determine if medication is necessary for treatment. If so, the child will meet for medication management once a month or more often as needed.</p> <p>Emergency Shelter Care Program: The shelter care program is designed to support Community Partnership for Children youth who are in crisis and in need of stabilization and temporary placement for up to 30 days. The child is then moved to the appropriate placement which could be a variety of options to include a home on campus, a foster care home or to a relative placement.</p> <p>Spiritual Development: We have two full-time Chaplains available to meet the spiritual needs of our residents. Residents have the opportunity to participate in two Chapel services per week to receive bible-based teachings as well as opportunities to participate in drama, choir and music lessons.</p>

PURPOSE/MISSION	The Specialized Therapeutic Group Home (STGH) at the Children's Home provides intensive clinical services for children diagnosed with various emotional and behavioral disturbances, ages 10 through 17. This program is co-ed and can serve up to eight children. The STGH is staffed 24 hours per day with direct care staff that is trained in trauma-informed care. Direct care staff provide structured mental health interventions.

AVERAGE LENGTH OF STAY	The average length of treatment varies to treatment plan and progress in treatment and is typically between six months and up to one year.
COUNSELOR INFORMATION	<p>The children in the STGH receive intensive individual therapy two hours per week and group therapy sessions three hours per week with a master's level counselor who specializes in trauma-informed care. The therapeutic groups focus on anger management, social and coping skills training. The primary therapist facilitates family therapy sessions as well to aid the family in discovering communication patterns, parent skills training along with relationship healing and building to promote reunification when possible. The therapist utilizes various treatment modalities individualized to meet the specific needs of each child and family. Equine assisted psychotherapy is also offered to our residents through a partnership with a local community provider.</p> <p>Our agency contracts with a board certified behavior analyst who creates and assists with the implementation of individualized behavior plans. The behavior analyst attends treatment team meetings and provides regular staff trainings.</p>

PURPOSE/MISSION	The Teen Mother Baby Program at FUMCH is a program serving pregnant teens from a holistic standpoint that will help them to become full contributors to their children, themselves and to the surrounding community.
CRITERIA FOR ADMIT	<p>The following is a list of exclusionary criteria. However, the Family Services Specialist will assess appropriateness for the program on an individual basis.</p> <p>High Risk Pregnancies as determined by the teen's treating physician</p> <p>Multiple birth pregnancies to exceed two infants</p> <p>Mental health diagnoses that cannot be adequately maintained without psychotropic medication</p> <p>Severe psychiatric disorders which require hospitalization</p> <p>Substance misuse, abuse, dependence or sale</p> <p>Chronic runaways</p> <p>IQ below 70</p> <p>Chronic violent behavior to include, but is not limited to, arson, felony weapons charges, crimes against people and severe property crimes</p> <p>Severe sexual disorders</p> <p>Physical handicaps which may limit the child's ability to participate fully in a residential program</p> <p>Medical conditions which limit the child's full participation in a specialized program for pregnant teens. AVERAGE LENGTH OF STAY	Length of stay may vary according to the needs of the mother and her child. A mother and child may remain in the home until the mother's eighteenth birthday. For adult teen mothers who may need continued assistance, transition to our mother/baby residence for adults may be available.
COUNSELOR INFORMATION	Clinical services will be provided by an in-house Child and Family Therapist and is a core element for each resident in the pregnant teen mother program. A master's level licensed therapist that is trained in 0-5 mental health will provide individual, group and family

	<p>therapy. Recognizing that each resident is unique an individualized Treatment Plan will be developed for each teen. The treatment components will help the teens improve interpersonal relationship skills, develop pro-social attitudes and behaviors while strengthening their self concept. Each resident will receive weekly individual and group therapy. Family therapy is also provided when applicable.</p>
<p>SERVICES PROVIDED</p>	<p>House Mother Model - The system of care will be a family model utilizing two house mothers. Each house mother will work separately on a 7- day shift rotation. An assistant will also be provided as a support staff for an 8 hour shift 7 days a week. Trained house mothers will teach the basics of prenatal care, delivery and parenting while providing supervision of the cottage.</p> <p>Independent Living - Trained staff members will role model and teach the young mothers important skills such as cooking, grocery shopping, how to manage their finances and other important life skills.</p> <p>Single Rooms - Each mother and baby will be in a fully furnished, single room with a private bathroom.</p> <p>Fenced Play Area - The home-style cottage is equipped with a shaded fenced play area for the infants and toddlers.</p> <p>On Site Day Care - Once the teen mothers return to school, the infants will attend day care in the well-respected onsite daycare center at FUMCH.</p> <p>Education - For teens that are not able to return to public school in the community, we offer a quality education at Aldersgate Academy, FUMCH's on campus, fully accredited, private school.</p> <p>Trauma Informed Care: Staff are trauma-informed and recognize that many behaviors are often masked by past traumatic experiences. Staff receives ongoing training on trauma, attachment, relationship building and cognitive functioning by in-house licensed clinical staff. The licensed therapists are trained in Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy, an evidenced based model of treatment.</p> <p>Discharge Planning - We recognize the critical importance of discharge planning not only for the mother, but her child as well. The discharge planning process begins at admission and is reviewed frequently to adequately meet the needs of the mother and her infant.</p> <p>Our agency also has a full service Wellness Center, Recreation, and</p>

	Spiritual Life Departments to focus on the overall health and wellbeing of the mother and their child. FUMCH is proud to partner with several community providers to ensure the overall physical and mental health for the teens and infants as well.
